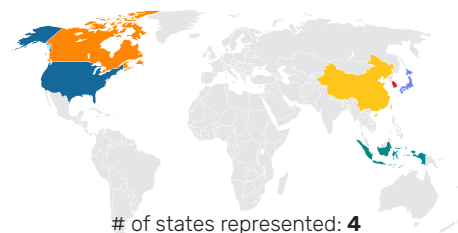

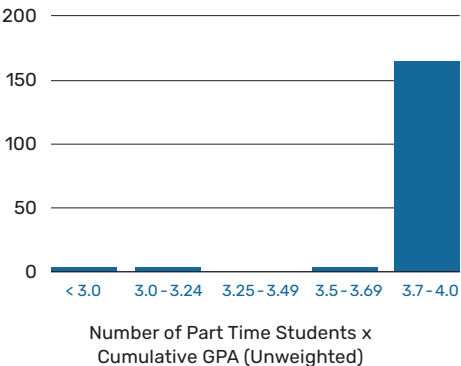

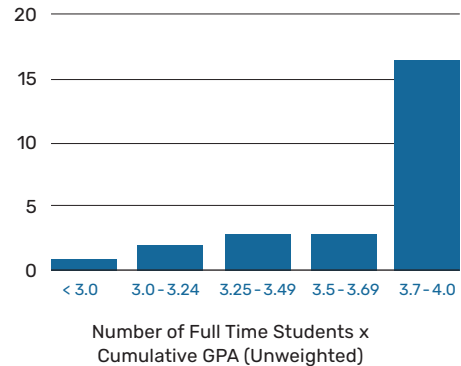
PART TIME STUDENTS
